















#### So ...what is a Dark-Sky Park?

It is more than just Dark! Officially described as:

A recognised park or other public land possessing exceptional starry skies and a natural noctural habitat where light pollution is mitigated and natural darkness valued as an important, educational, cultural, scenic and natural resource.

Sanctioned by International Dark-sky Association (est 1988), a USA based authority, with world wide recognition (UNESCO 2014).



### Dark Sky Objectives



- Creation of GOLD TIER Dark-sky Park in Mayo
- Develop Niche off-season Initiative for Astro-tourism & astrophotography, Archaeo-Astronomy, Sustainable Enviro-Friendly
- Preserve existing dark places without compromising safety
- Community Involvement eg Citizen Scientist, Stargazing courses
- Raise awareness of Impact of Light Pollution
- Connect with biodiversity & environmental objectives of Ballycroy National Park
- Target inclusion of light pollution in policy and planning
- Develop Dark Sky Network & collaborative model








#### Satellite images of light pollution/inhabitation






Broadsheet Map of Populated areas (census 2011)-


#### Night time aerial shot of Mayo Dark-sky Park




Land Boundaries of Ballycroy National Park & Wild Nephin

## Our Locations for Dark-sky viewing


Surveys taken from 12 locations around the area of Wild Nephin/Ballycroy National Park.
